Chair's report to the High Kelling Parish Council AGM May 2022

We have had a very busy year, we have maintained a full complement of Councillors. Meeting in Full Council every second month and through a Communication and Engagement Group on the months in between.

We identified priorities for the financial year 2021-22, having listened to what villagers told us as the result of the village consultation carried out the previous financial year.

Our main activities have centred around the following priorities:-

A148/Bridge Rd

We have addressed concerns about speeding and safety in general by:

Evaluating the purchase of our own SAM2, setting aside funding and looking at opportunities for match funding or better sharing opportunities.

Clearing the footpaths along side the road, obtaining an improved footpath from Avenue to Vale Rds, working with the Police to address concerns about speeding and identifying the NCC Highways Dept. potholes and other defects.

Planting and tubs along its length to empathise there is A VILLAGE in the woods.

Working with District/County Cllr Eric Vardy on Bridge Rd to look at solutions to reduce speed and hazards at the bridge itself.

The Queen's Jubilee Celebrations

Led on village celebrations for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, provided funding for events and a bench, planting and trees to commemorate the historic event.

Litter Picking

Litter picking both at the beginning of Summer and Winter, purchase of equipment.

Welcoming new villagers
Introducing a Welcome to High Kelling Pack.

Map and calendar

Commissioned a new village map and a calendar.

Planning

Continued to scrutinise and comment on proposed developments, commented on both NNDC proposals for the area and national proposals to reduce local control over schemes.

Wind Farms

Influenced the local, regional and national debate on wind farms and their impact on High Kelling.

Improving communication with villagers.

Funded, produced and had delivered monthly the High Kelling Parish Chronicle.

Produced an updated High Kelling Directory.

Updated the Parish Council website and introduced a village wide email system.

Included greater opportunities and time for villagers to question and comment at the Full Council meetings and the opportunity to speak with a Parish Councillor on confidential matters.

A second defribulator

Negotiations to purchase the redundant telephone kiosk adjacent to the village store have been concluded. It will be refurbished and equipped with a second defribulator.
